CB Relationship Managers Report.

DW Reported in addition to AS email report.

- 1. Age grade affiliations are up approx. 12% on same time last season.
 - Season 22/23 3,502 players registered as of 01/09/2022
 - Season 23/24 3,918 players registered as of 01/09/2023
- 2. Report for all spent Targeted Delivery Funding 22/23 has been received.
- 3. Report received for Targeted Delivery projects 23/24
 - o By extending our successful 'Schools to Clubs Link' programme in to Colleges.
 - By the continuation of our 'Schools to Clubs Link' programme, targeting All Girls Schools where possible.
 - o By funding taster sessions for those clubs struggling for numbers with their ladies teams.
- 4. Funding approved for bids in to the Adult Male Recovery Fund (£100k Nationally) £15k total to Lancashire after successful application.
 - o 20 x £500 Touch Rugby Events.
 - 10 x £500 Vets Rugby.
- 5. Club Development Team are now settling into post and are ready to expand their roles.
- 6. Key Targets.
 - Adult Male Recovery (RFU Project Phoenix) to target clubs from match card data. This seasons focus will be on Colts transition.
 - At Risk Clubs 3 have currently been identified in Lancashire. 2 have very depleted or no players and one is a facilities issue.
 - o Growing the Womens & Girls game growth targets set by the RFU at 35% will be a big challenge.

Minutes of the last meeting.

The minutes of the Board meeting held on Monday 3rd July 2023, (previously circulated) were accepted and signed as a correct record.

RFU Report.

1. DC reported that a Council Meeting had been held to discuss the appointment of a Chairman to conduct a review of the National Governing Body. The Board had suggested an external candidate but this was

- defeated by Council 30 votes to 27. Nominations will now select a Chairman from Council to lead the review which could take up to 9 months.
- 2. MJW felt that the Academy System of Premiership clubs was not working with many U20s players having no game time and therefore not being match ready.

Womens & Girls Rugby.

- 1. HH Is looking at changes in the Womens & Girls Structure after the RFU review of our DPP structure last season.
- 2. HH All sitting incumbents with the exception of one, had re-applied for the posts as well as new applicants. Applications will be reviewed.
- 3. HH denied that anyone had been dismissed from a role in the Womens & Girls structure.
- 4. KB confirmed that Sale Sharks are happy to assist with our DPP, we just need to give them the structure. Also Trafford MV had offered facilities and to host the DPP.
- 5. MJW we need KB to form a Women & Girls committee.
- 6. DC suggested an approach to Cheshire to partnership on the Girls competitions due to low number of clubs involved.
